

TTM Worker

Unit Standard 31958

Overview:

The TTM Worker is the first step to entering Temporary Traffic Management industry. This workshop explains the role of the TTM Worker on a worksite.

- ✓ Installing signs and cones
- ✓ Operating the stop/go paddle
- ✓ Safety responsibilities
- ✓ Using RT's
- ✓ Acting as a Spotter

The TTM Worker is registered as Unit Standard 31958 (Level 3, 5 credits). The qualification will display on the learners NZQA Record of Learning.

The one-day workshop is completed in two parts:

- ✓ Part A: Theory session – Knowledge of TTM Worker, role and responsibility
- ✓ Part B: Practical work – Skills in performing the TTM Worker role

The theory questions are completed during the morning briefing session.

The practical elements are completed first in the yard and then at a worksite during the afternoon.

PPE Required:

- ✓ High visibility (Hi-vis) vest. The TTMC-W on the tag shows compliance of the garment.
- ✓ Cut resistant gloves
- ✓ Safety boots are required and will need to be supplied by the attendee
- ✓ Wet weather gear (the practical assessment is outside and will proceed in wet weather)
